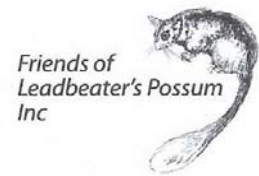




Friends of Leadbeaters Possum Tree Planting Field Trip 22 May 2010



In conjunction with Parks Victoria, FLBP propose to aid the ongoing survival of Leadbeater's Possum by providing additional habitat structure to the existing colony at Yellingbo Conservation Reserve. Additional trees are required to invigorate new growth and support regeneration of the forest as older trees and shrubs die within the system.

FLBP volunteers are needed to help plant trees and shrubs for use by Leadbeater's Possum. Plants will assist with creating forest connectivity which is required by Leadbeater's Possum to move through the forest. This is a daytime activity and requires volunteers to have a reasonable level of fitness to carry trays of plants and other digging tools and equipment require for the activity.

All training will be provided on site.
